
A LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

After buying the contents of a storage locker in his North Carolina town, Shannon Wisnant was surprised to discover a human foot stored in a smoker therein. When the rightful owner of the severed appendage wants it back, Shannon refuses, sensing a Golden Ticket opportunity to capitalize on his discovery, seeing visions of fame and fortune. As the battle for the foot gears up, hilarity ensues, with everyone from the legal system, to the media to the residents of North Carolina and beyond taking sides. Proving that truth is often much, much stranger than fiction, this hilarious, engaging and ultimately touching film with a heart of gold will leave you vowing to keep track of your own body parts. As Jamie</mark> tries to survive Onur and make a real connection with his daughters he must also face the prospect that the two things are becoming increasingly, hilariously intertwined. The struggle of an Olympic athlete is well-known and while most would not think that those competitors engaging in competition at table tennis would go through as much as more traditional athletes, this terrific film by co-directors Sara Newens and Mina T. Son proves otherwise. Structured as a traditional sports film building to its end battle - in this case the Summer Olympics – the film captures the struggle that these athletes, many of whom are high school students, face in the quest to reach their goals. As quick-paced and engaging as the game of table tennis itself, this chronicle of two girls and one boy intent on battling the world's best as severe underdogs brings new understanding to a beloved sport, and those who play it. What is the worst thing that you have ever done? This simple question is at the crux of a conversation between two couples at dinner one night when one of them admits his worst deed and sends each person into a spiral of hilarity and paranoia as they confront their own missteps. Bonds of trust are broken, re-formed and broken again as Max Casella (Inside Llewyn Davis), Jennifer Prediger, Onur Tukel (also directing) and Trieste Kelly Dunn circle one another, trying to figure out who they can count on and why you can never trust the delivery guy. Applesauce, which premiered at the 2015 Tribeca Film Festival, perfectly mingles comedy and drama in a quick-talking, fast-moving satire that will keep you waiting for the next surprise to appear. SPOTLIGHT FILMS



CALL ME LUCKY DIRECTOR BOBCAT GOLDTHWAITE

One of the most acclaimed films at this year's Sundance Film Festival, "Call Me Lucky" is that rare film that is both hilarious and heartbreaking. Legendary comedian-turneddirector Bobcat Goldthwaite turns the camera on Barry Crimmons, his professional mentor and a man who remains a venerated figure in the stand up comedy world. The film pulls no punches in its exploration of Crimmons' pursuits and crusades, both comedic and political, and in telling this fascinating, twisting story Goldthwaite has certainly made one of the finest documentaries of the year. (106M : USA)

> A breakout film from the Directors' Fortnight at Cannes, "Catch Me Daddy" tells the story of Laila, a girl on the run from her family and of her darkest night as she and her drifter boyfriend must stay one step in front of them. Wispy, atmospheric (set on the Yorkshire Moors in northern England) and tense throughout, the film gives a nod to noir thrillers and newcomer Sameena Jabeen Ahmed gives a standout performance in her first film role that you will not forget. (107M : UK)

CATCH ME DADDY DIRECTOR DANIEL WOLFE



Truly a unique film, director Matthew Bate (Shut Up, Little Man!) returns with another documentary hybrid utilizing decades-old footage. This one perhaps best classified as a documentary companion to Richard Linklater's Boyhood, it begins in 1977 when Sam Klemke began obsessively videotaping himself, creating a visual record of his life. That same year, the Voyager 1 spacecraft was launched, containing the Golden Records, a so-called history of life on Earth to be discovered by alien beings. Bate skillfully weaves the two together, showing that when it comes to the raw, messy life of a human- exemplified by Klemke and the life he has lived on camera - the Golden Record perhaps was not as complete as it should have been. Poignant, funny and at times melancholy, the film is - like life itself - a roller coaster of emotions. (90M : AUSTRALIA)



THE TRIBE



An utter masterpiece of visual storytelling, THE TRIBE is the story of a group of students at a school for the deaf in the Ukraine and the tumult of an entire year therein as a newcomer tries to fit in amongst the criminal element of his peers – the tribe. The film unfolds entirely in sign language without subtitles or voice over narration yet remains universally accessible, a haunting, sometimes terrifying look at the scars, both mental and physical, that can develop under exactly the wrong circumstances as a forbidden love threatens to explode the entire situation. Winner of the Critics Week Grand Prize at the Cannes Film Festival, The Tribe is unlike any film you've ever seen and its stark, often brutal tale will linger on in your memory. (132M : UKRAINE)





WHEN ANIMALS DREAM DIRECTOR JONAS ALEXANDER ARNBY

A werewolf-romance-coming-of-age story, "When Animals Dream" premiered at Cannes to great acclaim, as its unique style, characters and story make this a groundbreaking genre film. The tale of a werewolf being hunted down in her Danish fishing village while finding love recalls now-classic fare as "Let The Right One In" with its sensitive and sometimes bloody tale of an unlikely protagonist. Its underlying examination of a woman's independence in seeking out love amidst a narrow-minded community resonates throughout and provides ample food for thought. (84M : DENMARK)




DESIRE IN NEW YORK DIRECTOR AHMED ZIARI

When Karen's strong personality collides with her sexual addiction, she has to take a closer look at her relationship with her estranged son. Featuring a terrific lead performance by Jennifer Gegan, this NYC-set film is a throwback to classic, intimate independent films unafraid to look closely at the seamier side of life and the repercussions of such indulgences. IAM A KNIFE WITH LEGS DIRECTOR BENNETT JONES

Bené, an international rock star, hides from an assassin in Los Angeles as he prepares for a showdown with death. Add one part incredible Borat-like character portraval of rock star Bene and two parts hilarious, surreal and absurd conversations and intermittent Flight of the Conchords-type musical numbers and you get the full awesomeness that is I Am A Knife With Legs. (83 M : USA)







ODD BRODSKY DIRECTOR CINDY BAER

A winning comedy about Audrey Brodsky, a loveable loser who quits her steady day job to follow a childhood passion of becoming an actress. There's only one problem - she's not very good at it. But what she lacks in talent, she makes up for in heart, finding that when you learn to accept yourself, the magic in life is revealed. Hitting all the right notes of comedic timing and off-beat characters, while maintaining the film is a hidden gem of recent comedies. (93M : USA)

A riveting debut that features compelling performances, breathtaking Alaskan landscapes and a taut, emotional story of Mackenzie, a troubled teenage girl sent to live with her uncle in Alaska and her chance meeting with a backpacker (Bruce Greenwood) who helps her find the redemptive power of friendship. Powerful and gripping, Wildlike takes us across the wilderness in search of sanctuary in the last frontier. (104M: USA)



THE PHILOSOPHER KING DIRECTOR ROUZBEH NOORI

Beautiful Swedish landscapes engulf two brothers on a road trip, mirroring the looming decisions that face each. As they recognize the reality of how their lives have diverged, they must find if there is a place of acceptance they can reach. Honest, captivating and rewarding look at the way relationships - even those held together by blood - can ebb and flow. (106M : CANADA, SWEDEN)

RUNOFF DIRECTOR KIMBERLY LEVIN

The beauty of the land cannot mask the brutality of a farm town. As harvest draws near, Betty confronts a terrifying new reality and will go to desperate lengths to save her family when they are threatened with being forced from their land. A tense drama of family and fighting to keep the land that's yours, Variety calls Runoff both "Riveting" and "Inexorably powerful." (90M: USA)



SAFELIGHT DIRECTOR TONY ALOUPIS

Safelight opens with a tense scene in which LIFF alumni Juno Temple (2012 Centerpiece Film Little Birds) is threatened by her boyfriend/pimp and Evan Peters (X-Men: Days of Future Past, American Horror Story) intervenes, putting himself at risk for a girl he doesn't really know. Thus begins their story and Safelight seamlessly weaves these two together as they form an unlikely travel duo, seeking lighthouses up the California coast to photograph. Director Tony Aloupis perfectly captures a moment in life when everything seems possible, with a pitch-perfect eye to period detail and story. Featuring tremendous performances, including a memorable supporting turn from Christine Lahti (Chicago Hope), Safelight promises, and delivers, on its potential for greatness. (84M : USA)

ANTARCTIC EDGE: 70° SOUTH

In the wake of devastating climate events like Superstorm Sandy, NJ-based oceanographer Oscar Schofield teams up with a group of world-class researchers in a race to understand climate change in the fastest winter-warming place on earth: the West Antarctic Peninsula. Antarctic Edge: 70° South captures some of the most stunning footage of Antarctica ever put to film. Facing impossibly difficult conditions in a virtually unknown part of the world, they struggle against the elements to show how shrinking ice at the South Pole affects climates worldwide and documenting the plight of the Adelie penguins. Gripping, powerful and an urgent call to action. (72M : ANTARCTICA, USA)



BOOGALOO: THE LIFE AND TIMES OF A MIDDLEWEIGHT CONTENDER

DIRECTOR LIAM MULVEY•

Bobby 'Boogaloo' Watts the first fighter to beat Marvelous Marvin Hagler. A fighter out of Philadelphia who took a winding road from South Carolina to the mean streets of Philly, this film tells the tale of how he fought his way to the top of his sport only to be denied a shot at the world title and the unlikely turn of events in his life that followed. > What do snowboarding, medical school and Uganda have in common? The answer is Brolin Mawejje. This intimate film follows Brolin in his journey to become Africa's first Olympic snowboard competitor, documenting the struggles of his past, the pressures of his future and the intense reality of competition – both in snowboarding and in his pre-med studies - that engulfs his present as he rallies the support of an entire nation in his quest to make history for the African continent. FAR FROM HOME DIRECTOR GALEN KNOWLES



A moving, first-hand account of a family's struggles during the Cambodian genocide in the 1970s, told by a survivor. Forty years after the fact, Thell recalls in perfect detail the time period when the Khmer Rouge forced her family from their home and their subsequent life. Gripping, touching and chronicled through interviews overlaid with artists' animation and recreations of the time, the film deftly asks the viewer to become a participant in the duty of remembrance of a family's ancestry and a nation's past, to great effect. LITTLE PEOPLE, BIG DREAMS DIRECTOR MAK CK

LIFF Audience Award winner Mak CK returns to LBI with his latest film, and leads us behind the curtains of the most unlikely kingdom on earth. This is China's Dwarves Empire, where little people stand tall. Or do they? The film chronicles the journeys of several little people in their pursuit of happiness and explores the shades of modern-day morality. (89M : SINGAPORE, CHINA)





"The Search For Freedom" is a story told through the eyes of a group of people who helped create a cultural phenomenon. It is about the freedom that is accessible to everyone; the freedom that comes from living in the moment and doing what makes us feel the most alive. It's a visceral, visual experience via some of the brightest pioneers, legends, pros, and cultural curators of surfing, snowboarding, skiing, skateboarding, mountain biking and more. An American tale of life, liberty and independent radio, this tale of New Jersey's WFMU goes in depth, revealing the world's most unique station and Ken Freedman's attempt to keep it going in the face of persistent threats to its very existence.
