Shored Up*

Shored Up tells the vivid and timely tale of coastal development in the US. Set in Long Beach Island, NJ and the Outer Banks of NC, Shored Up is a look at what happens when we ignore the realities of geology in our drive to inhabit and profit from our coastlines. Filmed over three years and culminating with the impact of Hurricane Sandy, Shored Up foresees the consequences of our innate desire to live on the edge. As the film explores the political conflicts and personal stakes of communities along the shore in the years leading up to Sandy, it becomes an eerie foretelling of the storm's devastation and a witness to its dramatic aftermath. Bending Steel*

Bending Steel is an intimate journey exploring the lost art of the oldetime strongman and one man's struggle to overcome limitations of body and mind. The film follows Chris Schoeck as he attempts to become a professional strongman, from training in his small basement storage unit, to his very first performance on the big stage at New York's historic Coney Island. Alongside his trainer Chris Rider, he meets living legends and heroes within the strongman community. The film bears witness to a tenacious man struggling to come out of his shell through the unique activity of bending steel. What results is an intimate and touching story of Chris' search for fulfillment and happiness, two things which have always seemed just out of reach. Director Dave Carroll, USA, 92min.

Mother of George

Mother of George is an exquisitely beautiful (winner of 2013 Sundance Film Festival's Cinematography Award), gripping drama about a woman willing to do anything and risk everything for her marriage. A story that intimately shows the Nigerian immigrant experience through the eyes of bride-to-be Adenike and her struggle to adjust and fulfill the expectations of a woman facing growing demands from family, friends and her new husband. Gloriously rich in detail, featuring tremendous performances across the board, Mother of George is a dramatic achievement heralding the arrival of fresh, vibrant, important voices in director Andrew Dosunmu and star Danai Gurira. SURFING MOVIES

Here and Now

"Here & Now" was shot in one day. More than 25 filmmakers and surfers worked in unison to document the world of surfing in a single 24-hour period: May 2, 2012. From world champs like Kelly Slater and Stephanie Gilmore to free spirits like Dave Rastovich, Ozzy Wright and Alex Knost, this project brings together shapers, photographers, legends, beginners, third world, first world and surf world. Some scored big. Others couldn't find a ripple. It's all part of the surfing experience. From contests to camping, hanging at home or hitting the road, veteran surf filmmaker Taylor Steele pulls together an epic, international cast to prove the best place to be is here and now. Raw: The Movie

Raw: The Movie is a new vision in surf film making, combining surfing, the art of cinematography, and a mindful use of editing that synchronizes vision and audio. The film showcases a diverse range of the world's best surfers. RAW THE MOVIE will inspire, motivate and just amaze surfers, enthusiasts and non-believers alike.

Children of the Wind

Two brothers and a cousin journey from humble fishing families on the tiny Caribbean island of Bonaire to become three of the best freestyle windsurfers in history and in the process, both revolutionize and save the sport. Kook Paradise

Kook Paradise is one part social commentary, one part comedy and one heaping spoonful of reality. Kook Paradise is filmed on location at Ditch Plains Beach highlighting the surf culture in and out of the water. It is shot in the style of the surfing films from the 1960's , bringing levity and humor to that which surrounds surfing's current popularity in NY in particular. A Hijacking

A tense, terrific thriller that premiered at the Venice Film Festival, A Hijacking tells the story of the cargo ship MV Rozen as it heads for harbor when it is hijacked by Somali pirates in the Indian Ocean. Among the men on board are the ship's cook Mikkel (Pilou Asbæk), who along with the rest of the seamen are taken hostage in a cynical game of life and death. With the demand for a ransom of millions of dollars, a psychological drama unfolds between the CEO of the shipping company (Søren Malling) and the Somali pirates. A Teacher*

Hijacking

One of the most buzzed-about films at the 2013 Sundance Film Festival, A Teacher tells the story of Diana Watts, a high school teacher in Austin, Texas, who embarks on a dangerous spiral of behavior with one of her students. Showing the fascinating inner struggle of its lead character in a terrific lead performance by Lindsay Burdge, the film lays bare a personal struggle of character in the deftest of manners. Aquí y Alla (Here and There)*

Winner of the Critics Week Grand Prize at the Cannes Film Festival, Aqui y Alla tells the story of Pedro, returned home to Mexico after years of working in the US, now ready to pursue his dreams back home, but finds that things are not as he expected. The longer he stays, the more he realizes that many people have thoughts of opportunities far away, often north of the border. Pedro meets a teenager with dreams of the US, the looming place that somehow always feels very present, practically knocking at the door and begins a transformative relationship as his mentor. Filled with small, pitch perfect moments, Aquí y Allá is a story about hope, and the memories and loss of what we leave behind. Director Antonio Mendez Esparza, USA/Spain/Mexico, 110m

Grow Up, Tony Phillips*

The 4th feature film from 20-year-old director Emily Hagins, is a fantastical comedy about Tony Phillips, Halloween-super-enthusiast. But when Tony's friends decide that they're too cool for Halloween now that they're HS seniors, Tony starts to wonder if he's hopelessly behind the curve...or way, way ahead of it. A hit at the SXSW film festival, Grow Up, Tony Phillips is a truly charming coming-of-age story perfectly handled by a director who can relate to her subjects. Director Emily Hagins, USA, 90min

Fallen City

A story of the tragedy, devastation and human desires to remember following the 2008 earthquake in China, Fallen City shows the common humanity inherent in people following a natural disaster. The tale of three survivors from Beichuan, Fallen City documents the struggle to rebuild amidst ruin, as the Chinese government lays out plans to build a new city, but for those who survived, it's not so simple to move on. Through surprising turns, haunting visuals, and the personal and political drive to forget, Fallen City becomes a testimony to the universal human will to persevere and remember. Remote Area Medical*

A film that takes an in-depth look at a polarizing topic – health care – through Remote Area Medical, the pioneer of no-cost, pop-up health care clinics. Over 2000 people showed up at the Bristol Motor Speedway in April 2012 for a chance to see a doctor, and through touching, tragic and inspiring stories of those who do without and those who volunteer their services, the film succeeds by showing the reality that many Americans face. Gripping, poignant and ultimately rewarding, like many great documentaries it serves as a wake-up call to action. Director Jeff Reichert, Farihah Zaman, USA, 90min.









Rewind This!*

An exploding industry without rules! Backyard filmmakers with zero budget and a surplus of dreams! Videotape changed the world and laid the foundation for modern media culture. Low cost equipment created unprecedented opportunities. Major studios and small indies operated on an even playing field for the first time ever. The story of the home video revolution is a tale of both technological advancement and human ambition, and Rewind This! tells the rise and fall of the VHS format and the culture it enabled in an insightful, sometimes hilarious, and most entertaining fashion. Director Josh Johnson, USA, 94min.

Therese Desqueyroux

Audrey Tautou (Amelie) stars as a provincial housewife in 1920s France, whose suffocating marriage to a boorish landowner inspires her to a daring bid for freedom, in this exquisite period adaptation of the classic novel by Nobel-winning author François Mauriac. The film was the Closing Night selection of the 2012 Cannes Film Festival. Director Claude Miller, France, 110min.





Without Shepherds*

Six bold Pakistanis, in the middle of a nationwide crisis, stand up try to build a different tomorrow: a cricket star starting a progressive political party, a female journalist working behind Taliban lines, an ex-mujahid seeking redemption, a trucker crossing dangerous territory to feed his family, a supermodel pushing feminism through fashion, and a subversive Sufi rocker using music to heal. Filmed by a team of American and Pakistani filmmakers over two years, WITHOUT SHEPHERDS cuts through alarmist media depictions of the country to celebrate the bravery of its people. Director Cary McClelland, USA/Pakistan, 89min.





Butterfly Stories

'Butterfly Stories' is a magical trip to the world of butterfly people all over the world. Centered on a witty road trip with a cowboy named Wandering Star on the butterfly trail from Chicago to the highlands of Mexico as he searches for inspiration following the spectacular monarch migration. The film intermingles his story with several other vignettes of butterfly folks searching for their own transformations. WORLD PREMIERE Director Christoph Schuch, Germany, 81min.

Furever*

Furever is a feature-length documentary that explores the dimensions of grief people experience over the loss of a pet. It examines pets' position in a family unit, and studies the bonds that form between humans and animals, both psychological and physiological. NJ PREMIERE. Director Amy Finkel, USA, 81min.



GMO OMG

Today in the United States, by the simple acts of feeding ourselves, we are unwittingly participating in the largest experiment ever conducted on human beings. NJ-based female comedian Bonnie McFarlane and her husband (fellow comedian Rich Vos) set out to determine once and for all if women are funny. Featuring cameos and interviews with Sarah Silverman, Chris Rock, Lisa Lampanelli, Joan Rivers and more of the biggest names in comedy, the film is a hilarious ride of personal and professional discovery. Discoverdale

A fly-on-the-wall film crew follow comedy rock band 'Dead Cat Bounce' on a quest across Europe to reunite lead singer Jim with his long lost father, who he believes is the legendary rock singer and Whitesnake frontman David Coverdale. Following the Whitesnake Forevermore tour across Europe, they've got no money and no idea what they're doing - just blind faith that one day soon Jim will be sharing a jacuzzi in a 5 star hotel with the Dad of his dreams... and hopefully some hot Asian chicks.
